# FUSION Q's... Daniel 7-12 – Can We Trust the Bible?

#### **Discussion Questions**

Q1. After our series in Daniel, how has your view of who God is changed?

Q2. What do you think about the Bible? Is it trustworthy? If so, why? If not, which parts can't we trust?

Q3. Why can Christians put so much confidence in God and his word?

#### Read Psalm 19:7-9

Q4. What do you think the Psalmist means when he says that God's word revives the soul? Why would your soul need reviving?

Q5. How do you think that God's word gives joy to the heart? Are you in need of joy in your heart?

## Read Psalm 19:10-14

Q6. When we start to love God's word, it becomes delicious like "ripe strawberries". Do you think you could learn to see the Bible like this? What do you think it would take for this to happen?

Q7. This passage lets us in on a little secret. If we are not reading God's word, it is easy to lose our way and/or play the fool. Why do you think this is?

Q8. Do you read the bible? What would it take to get you more interested in what God has to say?

## **Bible Passages for Fusion Discussion**

#### Psalm 19:7-9 (NIV)

- <sup>7</sup> The law of the LORD is perfect, reviving the soul. The statutes of the LORD are trustworthy, making wise the simple.
- <sup>8</sup> The precepts of the LORD are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the LORD are radiant, giving light to the eyes.
- <sup>9</sup> The fear of the LORD is pure, enduring forever. The ordinances of the LORD are sure and altogether righteous.

## Psalm 19:10-14 (The Message Bible)

 <sup>10</sup> God's Word is better than a diamond, better than a diamond set between emeralds.
 You'll like it better than strawberries in spring, better than red, ripe strawberries.

<sup>11-14</sup> There's more: God's Word warns us of danger and directs us to hidden treasure.
Otherwise how will we find our way? Or know when we play the fool?
Clean the slate, God, so we can start the day fresh! Keep me from stupid sins, from thinking I can take over your work;
Then I can start this day sun-washed, scrubbed clean of the grime of sin.
These are the words in my mouth; these are what I chew on and pray.
Accept them when I place them on the morning altar,
O God, my Altar-Rock, God, Priest-of-My-Altar.
