*****Focus on why Haman was so angry**

- ◊ What did Mordecai refuse to do?

- ◊ Why do you think the officers at the king's gate told Haman about Mordecai's behaviour?

- ◊ What was Haman's response to Mordecai's refusal to bow down?

- ◊ How did Haman use his authority to punish Mordecai?

4. Redirection

The apostle Paul once said that he was determined to be the best he could be for God. In the same way, Jesus asks of his followers that they surrender their will totally to him. This is the only way that we can actually be the best we can be for God. Nothing else will do except giving all of yourself to God - total

surrender. Whatever we hold back do not surrender will always end up getting in the way of trying to be your best for God. What keeps us from making this decision to surrender is our own selfish desires and pride. When we are faced with the choice, always choose to be the best you can be for God - always choose to surrender to his will.
