Q1. After listening to the message, explain what it means to be an “idolater”.

Q2. What sorts of things do you see people worshipping in our culture?

Q3. Why would Paul say, “not even a hint...” when it comes to sexual immorality and God’s people? What is it about sexual sins that is sooo dangerous?

Q4. Paul says, “Don’t be fooled by those who try and excuse these sins...”. How might someone who is greedy, into sexual immorality (such as porn or sex outside of marriage) or have a dirty mouth try and excuse their sins?

Q5. We often justify filthy language and obscene jokes because they’re “funny” and hateful speech as deserved by the person it is directed at. However, the Bible is very clear that these are not valid excuses. Words and speech are very powerful. Explain in your words how you see this to be true.

Q6. Why does James say that the tongue is a “restless evil” and full of “deadly poison”? What is so bad about our tongues?

Q7. What did Paul say we should be using our tongues for in the Ephesians passage? (Leader – thanksgiving)

Bible Passages for Fusion Discussion**James 3:7-12 (NLT... p.736)**

⁷ People can tame all kinds of animals, birds, reptiles, and fish, ⁸ but no one can tame the tongue. It is restless and evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ Sometimes it praises our Lord and Father, and sometimes it curses those who have been made in the image of God. ¹⁰ And so blessing and cursing come pouring out of the same mouth. Surely, my brothers and sisters, this is not right! ¹¹ Does a spring of water bubble out with both fresh water and bitter water? ¹² Does a fig tree produce olives, or a grapevine produce figs? No, and you can’t draw fresh water from a salty spring.¹
